With the launch, the company has hired full-time general manager Richard Reid to spearhead the operation. Reid will act as a general contractor on most jobs organizing the sub-trades as required.

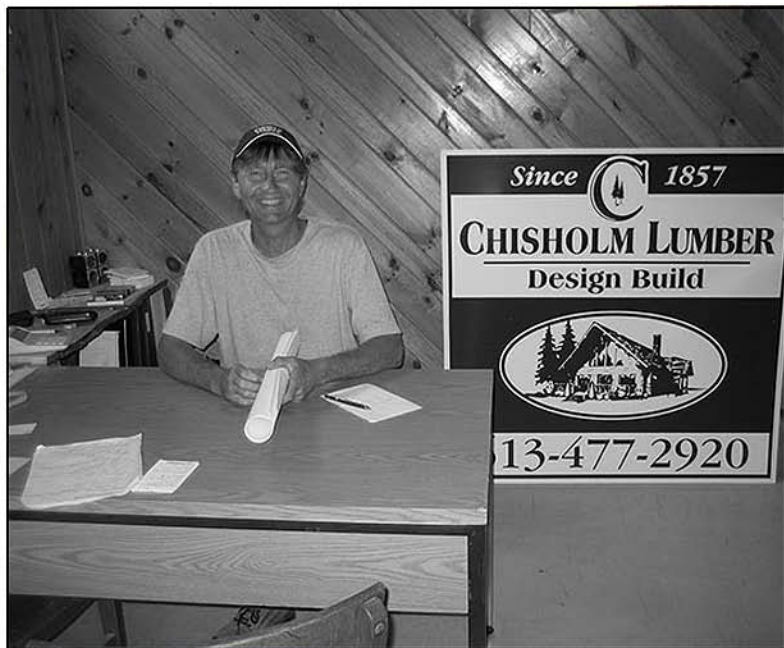
Chisholm Lumber is excited about its new business venture and its new Design Build manager. Reid has been in the building business for more than 25 years with his father Harold. Together they
